The Farm Show Experience

There's nothing like the feeling of walking in to the Farm Show complex and being overwhelmed by a sea of blue corduroy jackets during the Monday of the Pennsylvania Farm Show. For a lot of members,

Farm Show is one of the highlights of their FFA career.

Members get to be in a fair-like atmosphere, wear street clothes most of the day, compete in different events, and still get to attend the largest convention that the Pennsylvania FFA holds, the Midwinter Convention, with more than 6,000 people in attendance. Midwinter Convention and the Pennsylvania Farm Show are major highlights every year for the members.

When you walk in to the Weis Hall in the Farm Show Complex, the first thing you see is the food court. If you keep walking past the food, the tractors and the livestock trailers, you come across an area that makes it quite evident that the Pennsyl-

vania FFA has a home at the Farm Show. This area landscape displays, hardscape displays, window displays, and Agriscience fair displays. In the stage area, **FFA** chapters conducted dem-

onstrations regarding a topic of interest. Several chapters also competed in the Farm Safety and Health Quiz Bowl.

FFA members use Farm Show as an opportunity to show off what they are learning in their agricultural education classrooms and compete against each other. But the competition doesn't stop there. Pennsylvania has awesome members that compete in the High School Rodeo, show champion animals and even enter other goods to compete.

When Midwinter Convention rolled around on Monday, the Large Arena was filled with present and past FFA members and supporters of the jacket. A total of 351 Keystone degrees were issued. The Keystone

Degree, or the State Degree, is the highest degree that the Pennsylvania FFA Association can bestow on an FFA member. After 300 hours of working on a Supervised Agricultural Experience, investing at least \$1,000, being a member of the FFA for at least two years, being a senior in high school, and showing leadership in the organization, a member is qualified to apply for his or her Keystone Degree. The Keystone Degree opens the door to receiv-

ing the American FFA Degree, the highest degree an FFA member can earn, and allows members to be eligible to run for state office.

Another 356 first-year members of the FFA received their first FFA jackets. The Pennsylvania FFA Alumni hosts a Jacket Scholarship Campaign, the largest of its kind in the nation. At the Midwinter Convention, first-year members had the chance to put on their very first blue corduroy FFA jacket and zip it to the top in the jacket ceremony. This year was the highest number of recipients that have ever been awarded.

Midwinter Convention and the Pennsylvania Farm Show were a big success this year. We would like to take the chance to thank everyone who made it possible.
