Pennsylvania Fore FFA: 18 Years and Still Swinging

BEAVER SPRINGS, Pa. — With the exception of a brief rain delay at the Monsanto Fore FFA east event in July, for the 18th year the outings went off without a bogey. Nearly 250 golfers joined sponsors Monsanto and Hoss's at the two events to raise funds to support Pennsylvania FFA activities. Funds provided for the chapter and state officer contributions to the Monsanto Fore FFA event alone will return more than \$3,000 back to those who contributed auc-

tion items and the same is anticipated for chapter and state officer contribution at the Hoss's event.

In addition to those funds, it is anticipated that the events will raise approximately \$20,000 to support Pennsylvania FFA activities. Planning is already under way for next year's events and committees will meet this fall so that information will be available about next year's events prior to the end of this year. Pa. FFA Members Earn National Proficiency Awards

HARRISBURG, Pa. — Proficiency awards recognize FFA members who have excelled as agricultural entrepreneurs, employees or volunteers while they gained hands-on career experience. The program rewards members at the local, state and national levels for exceptional accomplishments and excellence in a Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) program. After being judged at the local and state level, Pennsylvania FFA submitted the best proficiency applications to the national level.

These proficiency applications represented

Pennsylvania well. Pennsylvania FFA members were awarded six bronze medals, eight silver medals and five gold medals.

There were also three applications from Pennsylvania selected as national finalists. Allison Hoover, from State College, was chosen as a finalist in the area of Food Science and Technology. James McMahon, from the Blue Juniata FFA Chapter, was selected as a finalist in the area of Home and/or Community Development. Zachary Mueller, from the Grassland FFA Chapter, was chosen as a finalist in the area of Nursery Operations. These finalists will receive \$500 and will be recognized on stage at the FFA National Convention in October.
