#### Attire

Official FFA Dress (recommended) OR
 Alternative Dress (when appropriate)

When Official FFA Dress interferes with the performer/performance, Alternative Dress is appropriate. This is to be a Performance appropriate uniform, costume, or other attire that is necessary to complete the performance.

# **Competition Rules**

1. Written Application	Not Scored	<ul> <li>A. A complete Written Application is required to be submitted in advance of State FFA Week, but is not scored.</li> <li>B. Contestants must be involved in another event at State FFA Week.</li> </ul>	
2. Video Audition	Not Scored	<ul> <li>A. A YouTube Video Audition is required to be submitted in advance of State FFA Week, but is not scored.</li> <li>B. Video must show the actual performance in Official or Alternative Dress so appropriateness of performance may be evaluated.</li> </ul>	

Causes for Disqualification: Failure to Submit Written Application. Failure to Complete Live	3. Live Performance 100	on the rubric according to four equally weighted categories: 1) Preparation, 2) Quality of Delivery, 3) Stage Presence, and 4) Creativity.  B. All contestants will perform live in front of a panel of three judges on Tuesday from 3:005:00 PM.  C. Contestants must perform in Official FFA or Alternative Dress.  D. Warm-Up/Set-Up time, in the form of equipment and sound checks, will take place immediately before the Live Performance. Please contact Myken Poorman (Bellefonte FFA) if extended time is required.  E. Judges will score all contestants/performances and scores will be totaled. The highest scoring act will win.  F. In the event of a tie, the three judges will vote to break the tie.  G. The Top 3 Acts will be recognized on stage on Thursday morning. The first place Act will receive a plaque.  H. Certain acts may be selected to perform live on stage during the General Sessions. This will be at the discretion of the judges, the Event Chairperson, and the Executive Secretary.
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**Causes for Disqualification:** Failure to Submit Written Application, Failure to Complete Live Performance

Tie-breaker: In the event of a tie, the three judges will vote to break the tie.
