

Pennsylvania FFA Foundation Sets Golf Fundraiser

The Pennsylvania FFA Foundation has announced that its 28th annual Golf Outing, usually held in July, has been rescheduled to Sept. 9 due to COVID-19 restrictions.

The event, held at Foxchase Golf Club in Stevens, is open to the public and benefits the foundation's annual fund, a cornerstone of financial support for Pennsylvania FFA and agricultural education in the state. The Golf Outing is one of the Pennsylvania FFA Foundation's largest annual fundraisers, and in 2019 provided nearly \$15,000 in support for this important fund.

The final golfer registration deadline is Sept. 1, though participants who complete the registration process by July 31 will be entered into a drawing to win a prize. Registration is \$125 per person, which includes 18 holes of golf, cart rental, a buffet lunch, drinks throughout the event, and a dinner program which includes awards and an auction.
