The Garden Spot FFA chapter at Lampeter-Strasburg High School is a perfect example of helping their fellow FFA family. This chapter had a calling to help the Vinton High School FFA chapter in Louisiana.

In honor of the National FFA Convention's National Day of Community Service, Garden Spot FFA organized a community service event. Their chapter teamed up with Grassland FFA and Elizabethtown FFA to collect, package and ship Hurricane Laura relief materials like paper products, tools, cleaning supplies, food and toiletries to the Vinton High School FFA chapter in southwestern Louisiana. The August hurricane was the region's strongest on record and caused massive damage, according to the National Weather Service.

Jeslyn Krebs, vice president of Garden Spot FFA, said that over 50 FFA members volunteered, spending four hours packing boxes worth about \$3,300 in economic relief.

"We are proud to make a positive impact on fellow FFA members from Vinton High School FFA Chapter in Vinton, Louisiana," she said.

Many FFA chapters across the commonwealth have struggled with the challenges of COVID-19. However, now more than ever, our 13,000 Pennsylvania FFA members are proving to be resilient. Like to the Garden Spot FFA, chapters are doing projects that make a difference for their communities.
