| CDE Changes from Previous Years <br> - Addition of the Team Skills Challenge. National FFA lists 21 possible team skills activities. 2 to 3 will be chosen each year for the team to participate in. National FFA rubrics will be followed. <br> Please note: The start-up of equipment will be prohibited. |  |

## CDE Outline

| CDE Component | Points | Component Description |
| :---: | :---: | :--- |
| Phase 1-Team <br> Activity | 150 points | This practicum involves the team members working together toward <br> accomplishing an assignment. It is designed to evaluate individual and <br> group contributions in coordination and cooperation of knowledge, <br> evaluation, and decision-making. The team activity has two parts: <br> 1) Team preparation-team members will receive a prompt and have 30 <br> minutes to prepare to sell or pitch their ideas to their audience (the judges). <br> 2) Team Presentation- Each of the team members will make a verbal <br> presentation to a judge based upon decisions made during the preparation <br> part. |
| Phase 2-General <br> Knowledge Exam | 50 points | 50 objective multiple-choice questions will be prepared on topics <br> reflecting subject areas in the objective. This area will evaluate the <br> participant's knowledge and understanding of basic horticultural principles <br> in producing, marketing, using, and maintaining landscape plants and turf. |
| Phase 3-50 Plants, <br> Pests \& Tools for ID | 50 points | Participants will identify 50 items selected from the provided list covering <br> the following categories: <br> Plant Materials, Pests and Disorders, Equipment and Supplies |
| Phase 4-Verbal <br> Customer | 50 points | This interpersonal relations practicum is designed <br> to evaluate participant knowledge of and ability in 1) verbal <br> communication 2) sales and customer assistance skills 3) plant materials, <br> plant culture and problems and 4) nursery center supplies and equipment. <br> *This will be done prior to the convention via e-mail |
| Phase 5-Team Skills |  |  |
| Challenge | 50 points |  |
| or 100 | points each | Each team will be given four skills. Members will decide who will <br> perform each of the skills (each member must do a skill). An official will <br> observe and score each participant during this practicum. The skills will <br> align with National FFA's Handbook on page 17. Skill \#2, 14, 16, \& 20 <br> will not be included in the rotation. Skill \#12 \& 15 (when they come up in <br> the rotation) will be stand alone and completed as a team. |
| Phase 6-Landscape <br> Estimating | 50 points | Each participant will need to evaluate a landscape design, read a landscape <br> drawing, determine materials needed to execute a landscape plan, and/or <br> estimate maintenance costs in a design. |
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## Causes for Disqualification:

1.Communication among other contestants is not allowed except during the team activities.
2. Any participant in possession of an electronic device in the event area is subject to disqualification.

Tie-Breakers: If needed in the case of tied individual or team total scores, final placings will be determined by comparing, in order, scores for the following:

1. Phase 2 - Written Exam
2. Phase 3 - Identification Section
