

Meet Brandon Bixler, Pennsylvania's National Officer Candidate

Brandon Bixler, an alumnus of Grassland FFA in New Holland, Pennsylvania, served as the 2019-2020 Pennsylvania FFA state vice president, and will be Pennsylvania's national officer candidate at the national convention on Oct. 27-30 in Indianapolis. The Pennsylvania FFA state officers had the honor of sitting down with Brandon to discuss his FFA journey.

Q: What events through state office made you want to run for national office? What truly inspired you?

A: The first time I really knew deep down that I wanted to run was when I attended the national convention. Our state's national officer candidate, Justin Kurtz, was an inspiration to me. It was a real privilege to attend the national convention as part of the state officer team and watch Kurtz go through the process.

A second defining moment was when my agriculture teacher Mrs.

Ranck asked me the question point blank: Are you going to run for national office?

I gave her the pretty typical answer at the time of "Oh, I don't know. We will just have to see."

But I will never forget her giving me that knowing look. At first, I was kind of taken aback. It was one of those instances of a time where sometimes those around us know us better than (we know) ourselves.

Mrs. Ranck knew that I was lying to myself at the time. She knew that I wanted to run and that this would be a great opportunity for me to pursue, and I would regret it if I didn't take the chance. It was really a moment when I knew.

Q: As a national officer, what are a few things that you would do to influence or change the lives of FFA members?

A: Many things are exciting about serving as a national officer, and one of those things that I would be really excited for is the ability to get back into some of those in-person interactions and events that we have missed out on. Having the opportunity to be a part of a normal year like that would be an incredible privilege and true honor.

A big priority I have is making connections with all members regardless of the background that they come from. I think we have a broad spectrum of students who are coming from all different backgrounds, whether that be race, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, and we all have a unique story. The goal would be to connect with members from all these backgrounds and show them that no matter where you fall or where you come from, there's a place for all of us within agriculture and FFA.

Q: Beyond FFA and the blue jacket, what are some of your life and career goals?

A: I^m in my second year of courses at Penn State University, and my career goal would be to become an agricultural educator. After graduating college, I anticipate teaching at the high school level for at least a few years or maybe for my entire career.

I am excited about teaching at the high school level as well as being an agricultural teacher and an FFA adviser at a chapter.

I had incredible agriculture educators during my time in high school, and it would be a real privilege to give back those similar experiences to students.

Q: How are you feeling right now, knowing that interviews begin in a few short weeks? What are your emotions like?

A: I am feeling a bit of everything. There are certainly a lot of emotions leading up to the interviews. This has been a unique experience for me, and it's unlike anything that I have ever done before.

All my time in FFA in the last seven years has really led up to this moment. There is a bit of pressure, but it has been fun to get to know the other candidates and build friendships through this. And thank you
