With 23 dairy shows in five days, including four days of youth shows, contests and programs, the All-American Dairy Show was a competitive but exciting experience.

While there, the state officer team assisted in many parts of the show while also seeing the behind-the-scenes parts of the event. The state officers passed out ribbons, performed ultrasounds on cows, and cleaned and decorated the show ring.
